

Carolann Brewer is a Smalqmix (Sylx) lawyer whose career has focussed on the practice of Indigenous law. A member of the bar in Ontario (1984) and British Columbia (2007), her practice has included matters related to self-government, land and resource development, environmental assessments, and Aboriginal Title and Rights. She held senior legal and policy positions with the Lax Kw'alaams Band; Hydro One Networks' Legal Services; the First Nations Financial Management Board; the First Nations' Forestry Council; Indian and Northern Affairs, the Chiefs of Ontario, the Native Women's Association and the Assembly of First Nations, advising leaders within federal and First Nation governments and government institutions. Her experience includes serving on various national committees, directing national consultations, directing national consultations, advising national commissions and facilitating ministerial conferences concerning Aboriginal matters. In January 2019, she was appointed under s. 6 of the B.C. *Utilities Commission Act* as a part time Commissioner to the British Columbia Utilities Commission, and is serving on a number of Panels, including the Indigenous Utility Inquiry and the Municipal Utility Inquiry. Her work with First Nations and the federal government, as well as numerous provincially and federally-funded NGOs, has given her a deep understanding of the principles of administrative law, policy development and public consultation processes.
